**THE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES COUNCIL OF NSW
RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION**

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

“Rich Fruit Cake”

<u>Here's What You Need:</u>	<u>Here's What To Do:</u>
250g (8oz) sultanas 250g (8oz) chopped raisins 250g (8oz) currants 125g (4oz) chopped mixed peel 90g (3oz) chopped red glace cherries 90g (3oz) chopped blanched almonds 1/3 cup sherry or brandy 250g (8oz) plain flour 60g (2oz) self raising flour ¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg ½ teaspoon ground ginger ½ teaspoon ground cloves 250g (8oz) butter 250g (8oz) soft brown sugar ½ teaspoon lemon essence OR Finely grated lemon rind ½ teaspoon almond essence ½ teaspoon vanilla essence 4 large eggs	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.• Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.• Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.• Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8”) and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.• NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Winners at country show will each receive a cash prize of \$20 and will be required to bake a second “Rich Fruit Cake” in order to compete in a Group Final to be conducted by each of the fourteen Groups of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW.

The fourteen winners at Group level will each receive a cash prize of \$30, and are required to bake a third “Rich Fruit Cake” for the Final judging at the Royal Easter Show, where the winner will receive a cash prize of \$100.

NB: Competitors may only represent one Show Society in a Group Final and only one Group in a State Final.

CARROT CAKE

Recipe from The Australian Blue Ribbon Cookbook

300g (2 cups) plain flour
2 teaspoons bicarbonate of soda
2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
2 teaspoons mixed spice
½ teaspoon ground ginger
440g (2 cups) white sugar
250ml (1 cup) vegetable oil
3 eggs, lightly beaten
2 teaspoons vanilla essence
440g tinned crushed pineapple, strained
465g (3 cups) coarsely grated carrot
90g (1 cup) desiccated coconut
120g (1 cup) chopped walnuts or pecans

CREAM CHEESE ICING

125g cream cheese, softened
90g unsalted butter, softened
60g (1/2 cup) pure icing sugar
Finely grated zest of 1 lemon
½ teaspoon vanilla essence

1. Preheat the oven to moderate (180 degrees Celsius). Prepare a deep 20cm round cake pan. Line the base with three layers of thin cardboard, stapled together. Use one layer of thin cardboard to line the sides making sure it fits tightly and rises about 5cm higher than the top of the pan. Staple the edges together. Then create an inner lining with baking paper.
2. Sift flour, bicarbonate of soda, cinnamon, mixed spice and ground ginger together into a large mixing bowl.
3. In a separate mixing bowl, whisk the sugar, oil, eggs and vanilla until well combined.
4. Blend the strained pineapple just enough to remove any big pieces.
5. Add the carrot, coconut, nuts and pineapple to the dry ingredients and stir with a wooden spoon until combined. Then add the egg mixture, stirring until combined.
6. Pour the mixture into the prepared pan. Cover the top of the pan with a square of cardboard, covered with foil. Bake the cake for 2 hours, removing the cover after about 1.1/2hours so the cake browns on top.
7. Leave the cake to cool completely in the pan before you turn it out.
8. ICING: Cream the cream cheese and butter until light and fluffy. Gradually beat in the sugar, and then add the lemon zest and vanilla. Stir until well combined. Ice the top of the cake and store it in an airtight container in the fridge.
