RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

“Rich Fruit Cake”

<u>Here's What You Need:</u>	<u>Here's What To Do:</u>
250g (8oz) sultanas 250g (8oz) chopped raisins 250g (8oz) currants 125g (4oz) chopped mixed peel 90g (3oz) chopped red glace cherries 90g (3oz) chopped blanched almonds 1/3 cup sherry or brandy 250g (8oz) plain flour 60g (2oz) self-raising flour ¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg ½ teaspoon ground ginger ½ teaspoon ground cloves 250g (8oz) butter 250g (8oz) soft brown sugar ½ teaspoon lemon essence OR Finely grated lemon rind ½ teaspoon almond essence ½ teaspoon vanilla essence 4 large eggs	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.• Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.• Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.• Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8”) and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.• NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Winners at country show will each receive a cash prize of \$20 and will be required to bake a second “Rich Fruit Cake” in order to compete in a Group Final to be conducted by each of the fourteen Groups of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW.

The fourteen winners at Group level will each receive a cash prize of \$30, and are required to bake a third “Rich Fruit Cake” for the Final judging at the Royal Easter Show, where the winner will receive a cash prize of \$100.

NB: Competitors may only represent one Show Society in a Group Final and only one Group in a State Final.

HUMMINGBIRD CAKE

Recipe from The Australian Women's Weekly

You will need about 2 large (460g) over-ripe bananas for this recipe. Cake will keep in an airtight container, refrigerated, for 3 days.

450g can crushed pineapple in heavy syrup
1 cup (150g) plain flour
½ cup (75g) self-raising flour
½ teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
½ teaspoon ground cinnamon
½ teaspoon ground ginger
1 cup (200g) firmly packed brown sugar
½ cup (45g) coconut
1 cup mashed banana
2 eggs, lightly beaten
¾ cup (180ml) vegetable oil

LEMON FROSTING

200g packages cream cheese
1½ teaspoons grated lemon rind
½ cup (80g) icing sugar mixture
3 teaspoons lemon juice

Grease deep 19cm square cake pan, line base with baking paper.

Drain pineapple well, reserve ¼ cup (60ml) syrup.

Sift dry ingredients into large bowl, stir in sugar and coconut.

Add pineapple, reserved pineapple syrup, banana, eggs and oil; stir until just combined.

Pour mixture into prepared pan.

Bake in moderate oven about 1 hour (cover with foil if over-browning).

Stand cake 10 minutes before turning onto wire rack to cool.

Top cold cake with lemon frosting.

Lemon Frosting: Beat the softened cream cheese and rind in small bowl with electric mixer until light and fluffy. Gradually beat in the sifted icing sugar mixture and juice, beat until smooth.
